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FIRST KITTITAS VALLEY WINE NEARING RELEASE

ELLENSBURG, WASHINGTON, NOVEMBER 15, 2010: Thrall & Dodge Winery, the Kittitas Valley's first wine estate, has produced the first commercially grown and produced in its bonded winery at the corner of Thrall and Dodge Roads.

Thrall & Dodge Winery produces a range of varietal wines crafted from both Kittitas Valley and Yakima Valley grapes, and is the oldest producer in Kittitas County's emerging wine region. It is owned and operated by long-time resident Troy Goodreau.

Two wines are produced so far. The 2008 red blend of Malbec and Cab Franc from the Cox Canyon Vineyard. Gary Cox is owner and viticulturist for the local vineyard near the beginning of the Ellensburg Canyon of highway 821 just south of Thrall Road. Both Mr. Cox and Mr. Goodreau are very excited about being part of the valley history. "The wines are coming maturing very

nicely and can't wait for our joint agreement to bottle" said Mr Goodreau.

The second wine to be produced is the 2010 Riesling which will be released this spring. The grapes for this wine came from the "Canyon Mist Vineyard" owned by Mr. Sandor Toth. This vineyard is located on the hill above Cox's Vineyard. The grapes were handpicked and with the winery just a few miles away were able to crush quickly.

All three are members of the Vineyards and Wineries of Kittitas Valley Association. This association was the incubator for the Valley's First Wine. The association is designed to help develop the Kittitas Valley emerging wine industry.

Thrall & Dodge Winery, founded in 2005, is located south of Ellensburg proper at the juncture of Thrall and Dodge Roads in the Edgemont area, long known for high-quality fruit production. At an elevation exceeding 1500 feet above sea level, the boutique wine estate enjoys a regional view looking out toward the Kittitas Valley and Mount Stuart beyond.
